Report of the Tax Collector January 31, 2019

- January deposits were \$19,525.22 reflecting \$4,106.69 from Hebron current year taxes, \$14,345.55 from Lebanon current year taxes, \$0 in Hebron prior year taxes, \$29.83 Hebron interest, no Hebron lien fees, \$623.48 Lebanon prior year taxes, \$232.67 Lebanon interest and \$96.00 Lebanon lien fees.
- Year to date collections through December are \$149,852.76.
 - Hebron: \$56,505.16;
 - Lebanon: \$93,347.60.
- I am compiling a list of delinquent accounts to turn over to Adam Cohen for the next round of collections. I am continuing to use the criteria of three years delinquent and a balance due greater than \$500.
- On January 22nd the State House and Senate passed, and Governor Lamont signed into law HB5765 to establish a municipal option to defer the due date of taxes which came due during the government shutdown. It allows affected federal employees an extra 60 days after the end of the shutdown to pay taxes without interest or penalty.

After a discussion with the Board via email, it was decided to see if any Amston Lake property owners would be affected by the shutdown. No one has inquired about deferring taxes. I have an application developed by the Connecticut Tax Collectors Association and approved by Adam Cohen for use if needed.

• I will be attending the Connecticut Certified Municipal Collectors meeting in March.
