Review Lake Operations: 2020-2021

- Sent out 25+ Email Blasts to the District
- Continued to support monthly Board and Special meetings during the pandemic using Zoom formats
- Installed updated district Ordinance Signs at all beaches and ROWs
- Placed social distance awareness signs at all Beaches and ROWs
- Raised \$250 for the ALD with the first online boat auction in September, selling several boats and the old dock ramp.
- Maintenance was performed on four Lebanon District roads

Review Lake Operations: 2020-2021

- Repaired "seawall" at Oakland ROW.
- Removed a number of delinquent boats from ROWs and racks after November 1st. Collected fines.
- Replaced worn wooden ramp at Lollipop docks with aluminum ramp.
- Proposed the hiring of a professional Arborist to establish a multiyear long-term tree maintenance plan to address Emerald Ash Borer Beetle in the District.
- Convinced Town of Hebron that large diseased ash tree at Elsmere ROW is theirs to remove
- Moved gate pole and large rock at Main Beach boat launch to facilitate easier backing of trailers down the ramp

- Developed a stormwater management plan at Manion and Deepwood Roads with the Town of Lebanon.
- Civil Engineering survey of Lollipop Beach, first step in continued stormwater management activity for the parking area.
- Barley straw installation at suspect lake inlets
- Coordinate water testing samples of 13 locations with Phoenix Labs and Aquatic Ecosystems Research (AER) for evaluation of Stormwater and Deepwater evaluation.
- Worked with Town of Lebanon Water Pollution Control Authority (WPCA)to track and ensure all homes are connected to the towns waste water system.
- Updated and maintained Amston Lake Management Procedures and Planning Guide to ensure lake health data is complete.

Lake Health Committee

- Developed a detailed document defining all the stormwater controls at Amston Lake.
- Competed catch basin measurements to determine effectivity and amount of sand collected.
- Provided input to the Lebanon 2020 Plan of Conservation and Development (POCD)
- Continue working with Department of Energy and Environment Protection (DEEP) to monitor fish population.
- Continue to share information with the District

Consider and Act Upon Revisions to ALD Ordinance 2008.5 (f)

- The Board was presented with a petition with over 60 signatures seeking to change the ordinance addressing smoking on district properties which is 2008.5(f). Since the petition cited the incorrect ordinance and should have been listed as an application, according to our bylaws, the board decided to simply present it at the annual meeting to be voted on by all of you.
- In accordance with Section IV of our bylaws, "Except as otherwise provided by law, the District's ordinances shall be deemed enacted upon the approval of a majority of the Directors at any duly-called annual <u>or</u> special meeting of the Board..." Rather than ask that the petition be redrafted as an application, citing the correct ordinance to be changed, or to be voted on by the board only, I as president decided to add this to the annual agenda in accordance with Article VI section 2 to be voted on by the voters in the district, you. If approved, the new ordinance will become effective 15 days after publication of its full text in a local newspaper.
